The chair thanked Rosie McConnell for attending.

Rosie introduced the concept of organisational membership. Some of the possible features of organisational membership include:

The organisation can gain credits: Individual timebank members could earn hours for TLT, eg if one member provides a service to 2 timebank members then one hour could be credited to the member and one hour to the organisation.

TLT can become a "money creator" in the timebank.

TLT can credit hours to their members (who must also be timebank members in their own right) for volunteer hours on projects that are agreed by TLT to qualify.

Timebank members can donate their credits to other good causes that are registered with the timebank.

Rosie can be an intermediary in brokering hours, or individuals can manage their individual accounts online.

Agreed that TLT will apply to become an organisational member and will nominate someone to manage the Timebank account.
